## **PASTOR'S CORNER - Why are We Late to Church?**

First and foremost, I must declare that Shafter does not have this problem. But it is something which we should be conscious of in order to ensure that it does not become one. And, truly, I appreciate the love and faithfulness you exhibit week after week. Blessings!!!

There are those who do not consider timeliness as being important. But point in fact, our timeliness reveals the fundamental attitude about what we think church worship is. Being consistently late illustrates our belief that church worship is a religious show instead of being a family reunion that we weekly look forward to. Imagine that our congregation is an orchestra and each week we gather to play, and God is our audience. Picture the conductor raising his baton and is about to begin when many of the musicians are still absent. Then as the first movement begins various musicians come in and begin squeezing their way into their chairs – visiting with those they are crossing. What message would that send to our fellow members and to God?

This may seem unreal, yet it perfectly illustrates what happens each week in some churches. There **are** legitimates reasons that occasionally pop up = life happens, and grace should abound in these situations. But the church is having a culture problem when large numbers of people arrive like this during numerous weeks of the year. These late comers are treating the first 15 minutes of the service like the previews at the movies, as an optional part that isn't essential to the main show.

Here's the uncomfortable truth: by doing this we are communicating, however unintentionally, that it is fine to show up late This message comes across as a discouragement to our fellow family members. Over the years it can easily create a culture that undermines our purpose for gathering.

Next week we will continue giving a look at this potential problem so as to avoid it becoming a reality for us. Thankfully, I repeat, we do not have a problem with this issue. You are so evidently unanimous about your desire to worship with one another, and I want to avoid this ever becoming a problem with us. Blessings! ©

The Spirit always prays according to God's will, and the Father knows the mind of the Spirit.
